

RESULTING QUESTIONS

What change happens over time / with new generations?

How can working principles be utilized and transferred to other areas/contexts?

Which spatial interventions can integrate them in the built environment?

WHAT CHANGE HAPPENS OVER TIME / WITH NEW GENERATIONS?

- More motorized individual vehicles / higher electricity supply
- Rising 'need' of night activities / changing society
- More seclusion / gated areas / condominiums
- More night activities in self-planned settlements through higher density & inability to come to central districts
- Higher crime potential embraced by seclusion & inequality




